His current research interests include baseband signal processing and circuit design, OFDM, and data networks.

From August 2003 to July 2005, he has served as the member of the Communications Promotion Committee, Academia-Industry Consortium for Southern Taiwan Science

Park. From August 2005 to October 2008, he has served as the Chief of the Division of Industry Collaboration, Office of Research Affairs, NSYSU. From October 2008 to July 2009, he has acted as the Division Chief of the Engineering Technology Research and Promotion Center, NSYSU. From August 2008 to September 2010, he has also served as the General Secretary of the Taiwan Institute of Electrical and Electronic Engineering. He has served as various chairs or co-chairs of 16 conferences. He has also served as the member of technical program committee for more than 35 conferences. He is currently the Associate Editor of the IEEE Transactions on Broadcasting, the Founding Chapter Chair of the IEEE Tainan Section Broadcasting Technology Society, and the Member of Editorial Board of the Far East Journal of Electronics and Communications. He is also the lead guest editor of the special issue on Advances in Antenna Design and System Technologies for International Journal of Antenna and Propagation. He is a senior member of the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers (IEEE), and life members of the Chinese Institute of Engineers (CIE), the Chinese Institute of Electrical Engineering (CIEE), and the Taiwan Institute of Electrical and Electronic Engineering (TIEEE).
